Club Culture & Dress Code



BUSINESS CASUAL ATTIRE

The London Club is a place for Members to relax, entertain, connect with other business professionals and similar types of people, and enjoy extraordinary events in a sophisticated environment. As a private Club the behavior and conduct of each Member reflects on the reputation of all Members. The following Member code has been adopted by the board to guide the Member in understanding their responsibilities in maintaining the positive reputation that the club has earned over many years.

DRESS CODE

Business-casual attire, as described below, is permitted throughout the Club:

- During select scheduled events, the Club may implement event-specific dress codes.
- Members and Guests are requested to leave outerwear (including coats, hats, scarves, gloves, and winter boots) in the cloakrooms.
- In the JAT, during pre-and-post London Knights home game dates, game jerseys, sweaters and team t-shirts are acceptable.
- Shoes must be always worn in all areas of the Clubhouse.
- Casual attire is permitted while picking up take-out from the Club.
- It is the responsibility of Members to inform their Guests of Club-appropriate attire and ensure that their guests comply with the Club's appropriate attire policy. A Member may ask for assistance from Staff in ensuring compliance of such Member's Guest with appropriate attire.

BUSINESS-CASUAL ATTIRE FOR GENTLEMEN

- Tailored pants
- Shirts with collars and sleeves, turtleneck sweaters
- Dress denim is defined as high quality denim that is not frayed, worn, torn, or patched

BUSINESS CASUAL ATTIRE FOR LADIES

- Tailored pants
- Skirts
- Shirts, blouses and dresses and tops
- Dress denim is defined as high quality denim that is not frayed, worn, torn, or patched

SPECIAL EVENT ATTIRE

- <u>Cocktail</u>: Business suit or stylish jacket coordinated with slacks/skirt with an appropriate dress shirt. Tie or bow tie is optional. Dressy pantsuit, jumpsuit, or chic party dress. Coordinating footwear.
- <u>Formal/Black Tie</u>: Dark suit or tuxedo. Tie or bow tie, or cultural equivalent such as kilt or military dress uniform. Long gown, elegant pant suit/ knee length dress. Dress shoes.

NOT PERMITTED ANYWHERE IN THE CLUB

- Hats
- Torn or frayed clothing of any kind, including torn or frayed denim clothing
- Athletic wear (including shorts)
- T-shirt apparel with or without slogan or commercial advertising (the only limited exception of the JAT, as stated above)
- Sweatshirts
- Beach sandals
- Running shoes or athletic shoes
- Inappropriately revealing attire

The General Manager or most senior staff member on duty will determine what is/is not appropriate, which may result in refusal of entry, or the Member being asked to leave the Club and return with appropriate attire.
